### **1. DATES**

The 23<sup>rd</sup> SEA GAMES Artistic Gymnastics Competition will be held from November 29 to December 1 2005 , Rhythmic Gymnastics Competition from December 2 to 4 2005 and Sports Aerobics Competition from December 4 to 5, 2005.

### **2. VENUE**

The Competition will be held at San Beda College Stadium, Alabang, Muntinlupa, Phillippines.

### **3. EVENT**

The Competition will be carried out in accordance with the Technical Regulation of the Federation International Gymnastics (FIG) and will consist of the following:

#### **3.1 Artistic Gymnastics**

Competition I : Comp. II & III , Qualification and Team  
Comp.Final.

Competition II : All-Around Individual Competition

Competition III : Apparatus Finals

### **GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS**

#### **1. RULES**

The 23<sup>rd</sup> SEA GAMES Gymnastics Competition will be conducted in accordance with the 2001 FIG code of Points for Men and Women Artistic Gymnastics and 2005 for Rhythmic Gymnastics and Aerobics Gymnastics and the FIG Technical Regulation 2002 . In case of disagreement in the interpretation of Rules, the English text shall prevail. Any unforeseen incident not covered by the rules shall be dealt with accordingly in the following manner :

- a. Technical questions shall be resolved in accordance with the FIG and SEAGCON Rules.
- b. Cases of general nature shall be resolved in accordance with the SEA Games Federation Statutes and rules (2005). Particularly, the following rules shall have precedence.

#### **SEAGF Rules 31 : Eligibility Code**

To be eligible for participation in the SEA Games, a competitor must comply with the SEA Games Federation Statutes and Rules as well as Rules 45 and the By-Laws to Rule 45 of the Olympic Charter.

#### **SEAGF Rule 32 – Nationality of Competitor**

Only nationals of the country of the NOC shall be qualified to represent the NOC in the Games. All disputes relating to the determination of the country which competitor may represent in the SEA Games shall be resolved by the Executive Committee in accordance with the By-Laws to Rule 46 of the Olympic Charter.

**SEAGF Rule 34 – Medical Code:**

- a. Doping violation as defined by the WADA Code is forbidden.
- b. All competitors are liable to medical control and examination carried out in conformity with the rules of the International Olympic Committee Medical Commission, the WADA Anti-Doping Code and Explanatory documents.
- c. Competitors in sports restricted to women must comply with the prescribed tests for femininity, when needed.
- d. Any competitor refusing to submit for a medical control or examination or is found guilty of an Anti-doping violation shall be excluded from the SEA games. The principles of exclusion for teams and individuals shall be in accordance with the WADA Code.
- e. A medal may be withdrawn by order of the Executive Committee on the proposal of the Chairman of the Organizing Committee.
- f. A Medical Commission as approved by the Medical Committee of the SEAG Federation will be set up to implement these rules. Members of which be nominated by their respective NOC as approved by the Medical Commission of the SEAG Federation.
- g. The above regulations shall in no way affect further sanctions by the International Federation.

**SEAGF Rule 38 – Number of Entries:**

The maximum number of entries from each nation in each event is fixed by the Federation in consultation with the Host NOC. However, the following numbers cannot be exceeded:

- a. For individual events, including singles and doubles event, there shall only be two (2) entries from each NOC (excluding reserves). For the sports of Arnis, Bodybuilding, Boxing, Judo, Karate-do, Muay, Pencak Silat, Taekwondo, Weightlifting, Wrestling, and Wushu, there shall only be one (1) entry per weight category from each NOC, and for Sailing where there shall only be one (1) entry per event from each NOC. Any event with three (3) or more members to make up a team shall be deemed to be a team event, and there shall only be one team (entry) from each NOC.
- b. For team events, one (1) team per nation, the number of reserves shall not exceed the number of players allowed by the International Federation.
- c. For events where both team and individual competitions are conducted at the same time, the competitors for any one NOC cannot win more than two (2) medals in their respective individual events.

**SEAGF Rule 41 – International Federation:**

- a. The Organizing Committee shall write to the International Federation or the Asian Sports Federation concerned for their permission to hold their sport in the Games. The Organizing Committee may invite a representative who shall arrive at least three (3) days before the beginning of the first event of their sport in order to check the facilities and equipment and arrange the entries, which conform to its rules and the rules of the SEAGF.
- b. The Organizing Committee shall pay the accommodation, meals and local expenses of its representative at the established rate of the Organizing Committee until two (2) days after the closing of their competition.
- c. In exceptional cases, if for technical reasons the presence of additional delegates is necessary, the appropriate arrangements shall be made with the Organizing Committee; the Executive Committee must be previously informed. In case of disagreement, the Executive Committee shall decide.

#### **SEAGF Rule 42 – Technical Officials and Jury of Appeal:**

- a. The necessary Technical Officials (referees, judges, umpires, timekeepers, inspectors, etc.) and a Jury of Appeal for each sport shall be appointed by the appropriate National Federation of the Host Country, which shall direct their work in conjunction with the Organizing Committee.
- b. If technical officials are needed from the other Member Organizations, to be invited to the Games, the Organizing Committee shall seek approval from the Executive Committee. Should the Executive Committee approve the request, the Organizing Committee shall pay their expenses for accommodation, meals, and local transport for the whole period of the Games.
- c. The technical officials and the members of the Jury of Appeal must have never been professionals in sport.
- d. No official who has participated in a decision may serve in the Jury of Appeal that reviews it. The findings of the Jury shall be communicated as soon as possible to the Organizing Committee and the Executive Committee.
- e. Technical officials may not live in the Games Villages, but the Organizing Committee shall ensure and bear the cost of their living accommodation, including board and local transport facilities.
- f. The Jury of Appeal's decision on all technical questions concerning its respective disciplinary nature is final. They shall, however, be without prejudice to any further penalty, which may be imposed by the Executive Committee.
- g. The Jury of Appeal shall be composed of a Chairman/ woman, which position shall be filled up by the Host Country of the Games with a representative of each member country as members.
- h. The International Technical delegates to the Games may be appointed ex-officio members of the body and shall act only in an advisory capacity, unless their respective International Federation requires otherwise
- i. In the event of a dispute or protest relative to technical questions concerning its respective sporting event, representatives of countries in the Jury of Appeal whose countries are involved in the dispute or protest may be allowed to participate in the deliberations, but cannot vote in the resolution of the protest or dispute.

#### **SEAGF Rule 43 – Court of Appeal**

The Executive Committee on behalf of the Federation is the Court of Appeal, which will decide finally on all questions concerning the Games. NOCs or the Organizing Committee may submit questions to the Court of Appeal. In addition the Court of Appeal may intervene in all questions of non-technical nature outside the Jurisdiction of the Juries of Appeal set up for each sport in the programme.

#### **SEAGF Rule 44 – Claims and Protests**

- a. Claims and protests made to the judges on the grounds concerning matters of fact are decided by them without appeal. Appeals against other decisions of the Judges or with regard to any other matter must be addressed to the Chairman of the Jury of Appeal for the sport concerned by a representative of the NOC of the country making the appeal.
- b. For exceptional circumstances, any claim must be made within thirty (30) minutes of the decision giving rise to the claim. The Jury of Appeal after an

investigation shall then give a decision and this decision shall be irrevocable, except for the case of a disqualification of a team or of a competitor for infraction of the Southeast Asian Games Federation, which shall be decided by the Court of Appeal. All claims and appeals must be made in writing.

### **SEAGF Rule 45 – Penalties in Case of Fraud:**

A competitor proved fraudulently to have transgressed the Rules and Regulations of the Southeast Asian Games Federation, shall be disqualified and lose any position he/she may have gained. If this competitor's NOC is proved to have been a party to the fraud, his/her country shall be disqualified in the sport involved.

## **2. PARTICIPANTS**

- a. The 23<sup>rd</sup> SEA Games Gymnastics Competition is reserved for teams representing the National Federations affiliated to the SEA Games Federation and the South East Asian Gymnastics Confederation (SEAGCON).
- b. Only competitors who comply with the conditions laid down in the SEA Games Federation Statutes and Rules (2005) and the FIG Rules are entitled to participate.
- c. **Artistic Gymnastics :**  
Each nation may enter a complete team of six (6) gymnasts for both of men and or women.  
However four (4) gymnasts can compose of a team. If a country can not enter a complete team minimum of four (4), it may enter a maximum of three (3) Individual competitors for men and or women.
- d. **Rhythmic Gymnastics :**  
Each country may enter a complete team of four (4) gymnasts.  
However a minimum of three (3) gymnasts can compose a team, and or maximum of two (2) Individual competitors.
- e. **Sports Aerobics :**  
Each country may enter in 1- 4 categories as follow:-
  1. **Individual Men**  
A maximum of two (2) male competitors per NOC.
  2. **Individual Women**  
A maximum of two (2) female competitors per NOC
  3. **Mixed Events**  
One (1) male together with one (1) female competitors  
Per NOC
  4. **Trios**  
Three (3) competitors in optional sex per NOC  
A complete categories of four (4) are nine (9) competitors.  
However a minimum of one (1) competitor can compose for the individual competition.
- f. **Age of competitors**  
There are requirements for participants in Artistic Gymnastics, Rhythmic Gymnastics and Aerobics Gymnastics. The age of gymnasts must be at least twelve (12) years old on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2005.

### 3. ENTRIES

- a. Deadline for Entry Forms by Number(Preliminary).  
Preliminary Entry Forms by Number from each participating country, forwarded through the respective National Olympic Committee (NOC) must be completed and should be received by The Philippines Olympic Committee not later than 31 **May 2005 at 24:00 hours, Philippines local time.**
- b. Deadline for Entry Forms by Names (Final).  
The Entry Forms by Name must be received by The Philippines Olympic Committee not later than **27 October 2005. at 24:00 hours, Philippines local time.**
- c. Both entries by Number and by Name may be sent by fax, but must be subsequently confirmed with the original documents, by mailing them to the following address:

### 6. TECHNICAL MEETING

- A. The Technical Meeting of Managers from each participating country will be held two (2) days before the commencement of the competition.
- B. The judges meeting for MAG and WAG will be held on Nov 28, 2005, Rhythmic Gymnastics on November 29 2005, and Aerobic Gymnastics on December 2, 2005.

The time and venues of the three meeting will be announced later.

## COMPETITION RULES AND REGULATIONS

### 1. TECHNICAL ORGANIZATION

GYMNASTICS ASSOCIATION OF THE PHILIPPINES (GAP) shall be responsible for and have full control of the technical organizations of the Gymnastics Competitions under/with the guidance of the FIG, AGU and SEAGCON, in consultation with the International Technical Delegate, when necessary.

### 2. ARTISTIC GYMNASTICS

The Artistic Gymnastics Competition will consist of team all-around individual and apparatus final competitions for both men and women. All competitions shall be conducted in accordance with the 2001 FIG Code of Points for MAG AND WAG and 2005 FIG code of points for RG AND AEROBICS.

- 2.1. *Qualification Competition and Team Competition (Competition I, II and III)*
- 2.2.

Only optional exercises will be performed by teams which consists of 4 – 6 gymnasts and individuals gymnast not more than three (3) gymnasts in this competition. Only one optional routine on each apparatus including one vault (the first Vault) for qualification in Competition I (Team finals) and II (All-Around Individual) are permitted. Gymnasts who wish to qualify for competition III will have to perform two (2) Vaults from different groups.

In each event, the sum of the best for (4) scores in a team is calculated as the team's score of the event. This competition is final for Team Competition (Competition IV) and constitutes a qualification for Competition II and Competition III.

### 2.3. All-Around Individual Competition (Competition II)

The first twelve - sixteen (12 – 16) gymnasts (men and women) who performed to qualify in Competition I, will take part in this competition. A maximum of two (2) men and two (2) women gymnasts Per NOC, will be selected. Only one Vault will be performed in this competition.

Lots will be drawn to decide the composition of the groups, which will be made up of three groups of four-six (4-6) gymnasts in the men's event and two groups of six-eight (6-8) gymnasts in the women's event.

The starting order in each group and each sub-division will be decided by a draw, which will be as follows :

The gymnast who draws the lowest number in each group will perform first in the competition and will then work on the next apparatus to ensure proper rotation. The rest of the group will follow in numerical order.

#### 2.4. Apparatus Finals (Competition III)

The finals shall be held for the best eight (8) men and eight (8) women per apparatus in competition I. Participation is limited to two (2) men and two (2) women gymnasts per NOC who have obtained the highest total scores on such apparatus in Competition I, which on Vault apparatus means must perform two vaults in different vault groups, the total will be average from two vaults. The starting order at each apparatus shall be decided by a draw.

For each apparatus, the two(2) substitutes for men and two (2) substitutes for women, designated by the director of competition must be ready to complete until the start of the given apparatus, in case of withdrawal or injury of the qualified gymnast.

The results of the finals determine the Champion on each apparatus.

#### Order of Events

The order in which the competitors will perform on the apparatus is as follows:

##### *Artistic Gymnastics Men*

- a. Floor
- b. Pommel Horse
- c. Rings
- d. Vault
- e. Parallel Bars
- f. Horizontal Bars

##### *Artistic Gymnastics Women*

- a. Floor
- b. Asymmetric Bars
- c. Beam
- d. Vault

### 3. RHYTHMIC GYMNASTICS

#### 3.1. Team Competition(Competition I)

A team may consist of 3 - 4 gymnasts and each gymnast may subject to compliance with the following requirements, performing 1 to 4 exercises (maximum). A minimum of 10 exercises and a maximum of 12 exercises by different gymnasts are performed. The Competition program comprises exercises using Rope, Ball, Clubs and Ribbon. Each team must perform three (3) exercises on each apparatus by different gymnasts, thereby making a total of 12 exercises.

For gymnasts who compete in Competition I as individual only, the program comprises exercise on the 3 or 4 apparatus prescribed. Their classification, for the purpose of qualifying for Competition II, is made by adding the 3 best scores obtained.

Gymnasts included in teams will, likewise, be classified for competition II by the adding of three best scores obtained. All gymnasts who have participated on the apparatus concerned, will be eligible to qualify to participate in Competition II and III.

### 3.2. *Individual All-Around Competition (Competition II)*

This competition is for the twelve – sixteen (12 – 16) best-placed who performed to qualify in Competition I, is made by adding the three best scores each obtains. Participation will be limited to two (2) gymnasts per NOC.

This competition consist of four (4) exercises in the four (4) prescribed apparatus

The classification is made by adding the four (4) scores obtained with the four (4) apparatus. The winner is a gymnast who has obtained the highest number of point in four apparatus.

#### **Order of Event**

The order of exercise will be:

- a. Ribbon
- b. Rope
- c. Balls
- d. Clubs

### 3.3. *Apparatus Finals (Competition III)*

The Qualification per apparatus (Ribbon, Rope, Ball and Clubs) is given by scores from each apparatus in Competition I. All best eight (8) gymnasts per apparatus in competition I (with a maximum of two (2) gymnasts per nation) will perform again to decide the Individual Events Champion.

The winner of the Individual Events Finals is decided by the highest total score of each event (Ribbon, Rope, Ball and Clubs) performed for their round.

## **4. SPORTS AEROBICS**

The Finals Competition (Competition III) consist of 4 categories as follow :

### 4.1 *Individual Men*

Each nation may enter maximum of two (2) men competitors

#### 4.2 Individual Women

Each nation may enter maximum of two (2) women competitors

#### 4.3 Mixed Event

Each nation may enter only a pair of one (1) men and one (1) women competitor.

#### 4.4 Trios

Each nation may enter three (3) competitors of optional sex. In four categories, each competitor may subject to compliance with the following requirements, to decide for Finals Competition. The Competitors will perform one routine only.

The winners of the finals in each category will determine the champion of each category.

### 5 CLASSIFICATION

#### 5.1 Artistic Gymnastics

##### 5.1.1. Qualification Competition and Team Competition(Competition I , II and III)

The results obtained determine the classification of the teams and act as a qualification for Competition II and III.

Each participating nation is authorized to enter in the team competition with one men's team and one women's team of 4 to 6 gymnasts. On each apparatus a team will compete in not more than five (5) gymnasts.

The scores of the four (4) best gymnasts (men and women) on each apparatus out of six (6) gymnasts on each team except Vault, the first Vault will count towards in Team and All-Around Individual Competition and the second Vault will be averaged with the first vault for qualification for Vault Finals. The highest total score of Two hundred and forty (240) points for Men and one hundred and sixty (160) points for women determine the winner of the South East Asian Games Champion in the Team event.

##### 5.1.2. All-Around Individual Competition (Competition II)

The winner of Competition II shall be determine by adding the number of scores obtained in competition II (sixty (60) points for men and forty (40) for women) of six/four apparatus. Only one (1) vault in this competition. The male or female gymnasts with the greatest number of points shall become the South East Asian Games Individual All-Around Champion. in case of equality, The FIG Regulations will be applied.

Having qualified, participation in Competition II is obligatory. If a gymnast who has qualified for Competition II defaults for valid reasons, his/her Federation may replace him/her by one of its other gymnasts, provided that the said replacement has obtained a higher result in Competition I to that of the first named reserve gymnast.

##### 5.1.3. Apparatus Finals (Competition III)

The highest points obtained by the gymnasts in Competition III shall determine the winner in the same apparatus (two vaults in this competition) and the gymnast will be declared as the South East Asian Games Champion. Having qualified, the participation in Competition III is obligatory.

Gymnasts who qualify for more than 3 events are, however, entitled to compete in only three or more of these of their choice.

In deciding qualifications for entry into Competition III, where there is an equality of scores, the qualification shall be determined according to the total result of the Competition I.

If a qualified male or female gymnasts, for any valid reasons (injury or sickness) are prevented from taking part in the Competition III, his/her Federation may replace him/her by one of its other gymnasts provided that the said replacement has obtained a higher result in Competition I to that of the first named reserve gymnast.

## **5.2. Rhythmic Gymnastics**

### **5.2.1. Qualification Competition and Team Competition (Competition I)**

The team classification shall be made by totaling the best 10 scores out of 12. The team with the greatest number of points shall become the South East Asian Games Champion in the team event.

### **5.2.2. Individual All-Around Competition (Competition II)**

The winner of competition II shall be determined by adding the number of points obtained in competition II of four optional exercises with the four prescribed apparatus. The greatest number of points shall become the South East Asian Games Individual All-Around Champion.

No consideration is taken of the results of competition I. In case of equality, the FIG Regulations will be applied.

### **5.2.3. Apparatus Finals (Competition III)**

The points obtained by the gymnasts in competition III shall determine the winner in the same apparatus and the gymnast will be declared as the South East Asian Games Champion. Having qualified, the participation in Competition III is obligatory.

## **5.3 Sports Aerobics**

Finals Competition (Competition III) for

### **5.3.1 Individual Men**

The highest scores will determine the Individual Men Category Champion.

### **5.3.2 Individual Women**

The highest scores will determine the Individual Women Category Champion.

### **5.3.3 Mixed Events**

The highest scores will determine the Mixed Pairs Category Champion.

5.3.4. *Trios*  
The highest scores will determine the Trios Category Champion.

## **COMPETITION MANAGEMENT**

The four (4) FIG Technical Delegates will be responsible for the organization and management of the competition together with the four (4) SEAGCON Technical Committee members of SEA Games.

They will make all the necessary decisions in connection with the competitions.

### **1. JURY OF APPEAL**

The Jury of appeal will comprise the following:

President of Vietnam gymnastics Federation  
President/Secretary General of the SEAGCON  
Presidents of the SEAGCON Technical Committee  
Head/responsible judge of the apparatus concerned  
Competition Director (responsible only for technical preparations.)  
International Technical Delegate concerned.

### **2. CHIEF JUDGES, JURY AND JUDGES**

Each participating country is requested to send two (2) male , two (2) female for Artistic Gymnastics judges , two (2) Rhythmic Gymnastics judges and two (2) Sports Aerobics judges.

All judges must be in possession of the valid FIG Brevet on the 10<sup>th</sup> FIG cycle for MAG and WAG and 11<sup>th</sup> FIG Cycle for RG and Aerobics.

The chief judges or judges of control will be nominated from among the members of the Technical Committee and the judges are designated by SEAGCON from the members of the NOC taking part who are holders of the 10<sup>th</sup> FIG cycle Brevet for MAG and WAG and 11<sup>th</sup> FIG cycle for RG and Aerobics.

Each federation taking part in Qualify Competition , Competitions , I ,II and Finals Competition ,Competition III has the right to present 1 (one) judge for one apparatus. The selection of judges for Qualify Competition and competition I,II and Finals Competition , Competition III are made by the drawing of lots (acting in sequence of alphabetical order).

Each nation may submit the name of one judge to be considered as the Expert 1 or 2 on the apparatus. A draw will be conducted to determine the Experts (panel A) from the names submitted.

The remaining judges will be drawn to fill the Panel B judging positions.

In case, there is an insufficient number of judges, the drawing of lots continues on the same basis but using the names of the federation second judges.

Chief judges of juries of control and judge's right and duties are specified in the FIG Technical Rules (2002) edition and the 10th cycle FIG Code of points.

### **3. JUDGES**

All judges have to participate in the judge's course will held two (2) days before the competition start. The selection of judges for Qualify competition and Competition I and II are made by the drawing of lots from all judges who

will attend two (2) days judges's course. For the Finals Competition and Competition III, Only one judge from each NOC is allowed to judge at the apparatus concerned.

IF a nation is able to send the third judge at their own expense, they may request that this additional judge be placed on the panel for Qualify competition and Competition I and or II, if there are positions not filled.

#### 4. **WITHDRAWAL**

Competitors who withdraw from competition without the approval of PHIOC doctors will be subject to annulment of all results they have obtained.

#### 5. **DRESS**

Competitors must dress in accordance with FIG Regulations.

#### 6. **MUSICAL EQUIPMENT**

All necessary equipment for broadcasting music recorded on cassette or CD will be made available to NOCs, Records will not be permitted.

### **PRIZES AND COMMENDATION**

#### a. **Victory Ceremonies**

The victory ceremonies shall normally be held after the competition of each event. Participants receiving awards must wear their officials NOC Uniform.

#### b. **Prizes**

The prizes for the Men's and Women's artistic gymnastics Individual and Team Competitions , for the Rhythmic gymnastics competitions and Sports Aerobics competitions will be awarded as follows :

Second Prize	- Silver Medal and Diploma for each Members of the team placed second

First Prize	- Gold Medal and Diploma for each Gymnast placed first.

Third Prize	- Bronze Medal and Diploma for each Gymnast placed third
Fourth, Fifth , and sixth Prize	- Diploma for each gymnast placed Fourth, Fifth, and sixth
