1. Dates and Venues

The 23rd SEA Games Judo Competition will be held from December 1 – 4, 2005 at the Mandaue Coliseum , Mandaue City.

2. Events

The 23rd SEA Games Judo Competition will be contested in the following events:

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Rules

The 23rd SEA Games Judo Competition will be conducted in accordance with the IJF Sport and Organization Rules (SOR) and Refereeing Rules. In case of a disagreement in the interpretation of rules from versions in different languages, the English text will prevail. Any unforeseen incident not covered by the SOR and Refereeing Rules shall be dealt with accordingly in the following manner:

- 1.1.** Technical questions shall be resolved in accordance with the IJF Rules.
- 1.2.** Cases of general nature shall be resolved in accordance with the SEA Games Federation (SEAGF) Statutes and Rules (2005). Particularly, the following rules shall have precedence:

SEAGF Rules 31 : Eligibility Code

To be eligible for participation in the SEA Games, a competitor must comply with the SEA Games Federation Statutes and Rules as well as Rules 45 and the By-Laws to Rule 45 of the Olympic Charter.

SEAGF Rules 32 : Nationality of Competitor

Only nationals of the country of the Member Organization shall be qualified to represent the Member Organization in the Games. All disputes relating to the determination of the country, which a competitor may represent in the SEA Games, shall be resolved by the Executive Committee in accordance with the By-Laws to Rule 46 of the Olympic Charter.

SEAGF Rule 34 – Medical Code:

- a. Doping violation as defined by the WADA Code is forbidden.
- b. All competitors are liable to medical control and examination carried out in conformity with the rules of the International Olympic Committee Medical Commission, the WADA Anti-Doping Code and explanatory documents.
- c. Competitors in sports restricted to women must comply with the prescribed tests for femininity, when needed. However, if women competitors can produce a Medical Certificate that she has already passed the test in World, Olympics, Asian, and SEA Games, the prescribed test for femininity may be waived.
- d. Any competitor refusing to submit for a medical control or examination or is found guilty of an anti-doping violation shall be excluded from the games. The principles of exclusion for teams and individuals shall be in accordance with the WADA Code.
- e. In case of any infringement by any competitor or team, a medal may be withdrawn by order of the Executive Committee on the proposal of the Chairman of the Organizing Committee.
- f. A Medical Commission as approved by the Medical Committee of the SEAG Federation will be set up to implement these rules. Members of this Medical Commission shall not include the Medical Committee member of the country whose athlete is under deliberation.
- g. The above regulations shall in no way affect further sanctions by the International Federation.

SEAGF Rule 41 – International Federation:

- a. The Organizing Committee shall write to the International Federation or the Asian Sports Federation concerned for their permission to hold their sport in the Games. The Organizing Committee may invite a representative who shall arrive at least three (3) days before the beginning of the first event of their
- b. sport in order to check the facilities and equipment and arrange the entries, which conform to its rules and the rules of the SEAGF.
- c. The Organizing Committee shall pay the accommodation, meals and local expenses of its representative at the established rate of the Organizing Committee until two (2) days after the closing of their competition.
- d. In exceptional cases, if for technical reasons the presence of additional delegates is necessary, the appropriate arrangements shall be made with the Organizing Committee; the Executive Committee must be previously informed. In case of disagreement, the Executive Committee shall decide.

SEAGF Rule 42 – Technical Officials and Jury of Appeal:

- a. The necessary Technical Officials (referees, judges, umpires, timekeepers, inspectors, etc.) and a Jury of Appeal for each sport shall be appointed by the appropriate National Federation of the Host Country, which shall direct their work in conjunction with the Organizing Committee.
- b. If technical officials are needed from the other Member Organizations, to be invited to the Games, the Organizing Committee shall seek approval from the Executive Committee. Should the Executive Committee approve the request, the Organizing Committee shall pay their expenses for accommodation, meals, and local transport for the whole period of the Games.
- c. The technical officials and the members of the Jury of Appeal must have never been professionals in sport.
- d. No official who has participated in a decision may serve in the Jury of Appeal that reviews it. The findings of the Jury shall be communicated as soon as possible to the Organizing Committee and the Executive Committee.
- e. Technical officials may not live in the Games Village, but the Organizing Committee shall ensure and bear the cost of their living accommodation, including board and local transport facilities.
- f. The Jury of Appeal's decision on all technical questions concerning its respective disciplinary nature is final. They shall, however, be without prejudice to any further penalty, which may be imposed by the Executive Committee.
- g. The Jury of Appeal shall be composed of a Chairman/ woman, which position shall be filled up by the Host Country of the Games with a representative of each member country as members.
- h. The International Technical delegates to the Games may be appointed ex-officio members of the body and shall act only in an advisory capacity, unless their respective International Federation requires otherwise
- i. In the event of a dispute or protest relative to technical questions concerning its respective sporting event, representatives of countries in the Jury of Appeal whose countries are involved in the dispute or protest may be allowed to participate in the deliberations, but cannot vote in the resolution of the protest or dispute.

SEAGF Rule 43 – Court of Appeal

The Executive Committee on behalf of the Federation is the Court of Appeal, which will decide finally on all questions concerning the Games, Member Organizations or the Organizing Committee may submit questions to the Court of Appeal. In addition the Court of Appeal may intervene in all questions of non-technical nature outside the jurisdiction of the Jury of Appeal set up for each sport in the programme.

SEAGF Rule 44 – Claims and Protests

- a. Claims and protests made to the judges on the ground concerning matters of fact are decided by the Technical Committee without appeal. Appeals against other decisions of the judges or with regard to any other matter must be addressed to the Chairman of the Jury of Appeal for the sport concerned by a representative of the Member Organization of the country making the appeal.
- b. For exceptional circumstances, any claim must be made within thirty (30) minutes of the decision giving rise to the claim. The Jury of Appeal after an investigation shall then give a decision and this decision shall be irrevocable, except for the case of a disqualification of a team or of a competitor for infraction of the Rules and Regulations of the Southeast Asian Games Federation, which shall be decided by the Court of Appeal. All claims and appeals must be made in writing.

SEAGF Rule 45 – Penalties in Case of Fraud:

A competitor proved fraudulently to have transgressed the Rules and Regulations of the Southeast Asian Games Federation, shall be disqualified and lose any position he/she may have gained. If this competitor's Member Organization is proved to have been a party to the fraud, his/her country shall be disqualified in the sport involved.

2. Participants

- 2.1. The 23rd SEA Games Judo Competition is reserved for teams representing National Federations affiliated to the SEA Games Federation.
- 2.2. Only competitors who comply with the conditions laid down in the SEAGF Statutes and Rules (2005) and the IJF Rules are entitled to participate.
- 2.3. Each country may enter a maximum of one (1) competitor per weight category.
- 2.4. The minimum age of any competitor is eighteen (18) years old on the day of the event. In the event that any country enters a competitor below the minimum age limit, the competitor may only participate by producing his/her parents' authorization letter.
- 2.5. Three participants from three different countries must compete in a category in order that the competition for that category may be held.

3. Entries

- 3.1. Entries in each participating country must be submitted in accordance with the regulation laid down by the Organizing Committee of the 23rd SEA Games.
- 3.2. Preliminary Deadline for "Entry by Number"
Preliminary entry forms by number from each participating country, forwarded through the respective National Olympic Committee (NOC),

must be completed and should be received by PhilSOC not later than 31 May 2005 at 2400 hours Philippine time (GMT +8).

3.3. Final Deadline for "Entry by Name"

The entry forms by name must be received by PhilSOC not later than 27 October 2005 at 2400 hours Philippine time (GMT +8).

4. Technical Meeting

The Technical Meeting will be held one (1) day before the commencement of the competition. The time and venue of the meeting will be announced later.

COMPETITION GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Technical Organization

The Philippine Amateur Judo Association is responsible for and has full control of the technical organization of the Judo competition, in consultation with the International Technical Delegate when necessary.

2. System of Competition

2.1. The competitions of the 23rd SEA Games are staged along the single elimination with double repechage system. The competitions of each weight category are separated into two tables by a draw. From each group, one semi-finalist is established by the elimination system.

2.2. By the semi-final each winner of each group must fight against the loser of the other group by crossing.

2.3. The winners of the semi-final should fight in the final for gold and silver medals.

2.4. The two (2) losers of the semi-final will be awarded bronze medals.

3. Contest Duration

Men	-	5 minutes
Women	-	5 minutes

4. Drawing of Lots

The Drawing of Lots for sparring competitions shall take place in the afternoon of the day before the first day of competition or soon after the meeting of the Organizing Technical Committee for Judo, and shall be supervised by the Technical Delegate.

5. Weigh-in

Competitors in each category shall weigh-in on the morning of their respective competition day at the competition venue. The Un-Official Weigh-in shall begin at 0600 hours and close at 0700 hours, while the Official Weigh-In shall start at 0700 hours and end at 0800 hours of each day. Competitors who fail to make the weigh-in shall be disqualified. Competitors shall each have only one weigh-in. Latecomers shall also be disqualified.

6. Weigh-in Attire

Both male and female competitors shall be weighed in separate rooms wearing only their under wears or completely nude.

7. Weigh-in Officials

The Technical Delegate shall appoint at least three (3) representatives from the Organizing Committee to supervise the weigh-in each morning. At the end of each weigh-in day, the three (3) officials shall report to the SEAGF Sports Director, the result of the weigh-in and their comments, if any.

8. Referee and Judge

Each country shall provide one referee to officiate in the competition in accordance with the SEA Games Federation Statutes and Rules (2005). Each bout shall be officiated by two (2) neutral judges and a neutral referee, i.e. the referee and judges for a bout between two countries shall come from a third. The Philippines, being the host country, may provide more than two referees. The SEAGF Sports Director shall be the Chief Referee.

9. Consultative Jury

The SEAGF Sports Director shall also be the Chief of the Consultative Jury, assisted by the highest Judo grade-holder of the host country as member. The Consultative Jury may consult the Referees and also may be consulted by the Referees if there is any difficulty.

PRIZES AND COMMENDATION

1. Victory Ceremonies

The Victory Ceremonies shall normally be held after the completion of each event. Participants receiving awards must wear official NOC uniform.

2. Prizes

The prizes will be awarded as follows:

- First Prize : Gold Medal and Diploma to the winner in each category.
- Second Prize : Silver Medal and Diploma to the athlete placed second in each category.
- (2) Third Prizes: (2) Bronze Medals and Diplomas to the losing semi-finalists in each category.

There shall be no tie for gold, silver or bronze medal placing, except in events where there is no play-off between semi-finalists for the bronze medal. Should there be a tie at the end of a competition for the gold, silver, or bronze placing, a sudden death play-off shall be held to break the tie.
